**I Sing a Song  
of the Saints of God**

Lesbia Lesley Scott  
(1898-1986) wrote  
pedagogical  
and inspirational hymns  
for her three children  
during the 1920s.

This hymn was composed  
for All Saints' Day.  
It stresses that saints  
not only lived in the distant  
past but also may live  
and work today  
as they carry out  
the everyday activities  
of their lives.

The United Methodist  
Hymnal contextualized  
the language written three  
quarters of a century ago  
in England for the North  
American hymn singer:  
*“You can meet them  
in school, on the street,  
in the store, In church,  
by the sea,  
in the house next door,  
They are saints of God,  
whether rich or poor....”*
