Mountains Are All Aglow

A season of harvest unites
peoples around the world.
Sharing the bounty of God's
creation is part of human
expectations and cycles of
living. "Mountains are all
aglow" is the one of Korean
equivalent of a favorite
harvest hymn for Euro-North
American Christians, "Come,
ye thankful people, come"
by British Anglican,
Henry Alford.

Those of us who live in the
northern hemisphere can
identify with the images found
in the hymn "Mountains are
all aglow." "Autumn colors"
and "golden fields" are a part
of scenery of the upper
Midwest United States. The
ripened harvest itself
becomes an act of praise to
God, the Creator of all
harvests.

A two-headed traditional
Korean drum in the shape of
an hourglass, the janggoo
makes a delightful
accompaniment for
the hymn.

This hymn first appeared in
the 1967 Korean Hymnal and
later in the 1989 United
Methodist Hymnal.
