There is a shared theme in all of these events, Remembrance and Change. Remembrance, gratitude, change and transition for one journey's end and a new beginning. A time full of memories as we race into summer, which always goes too fast.

Change is many things. For some it is exciting and fun. For others it is scary and dreaded. Sometimes it is the kind of change. Saying goodbye to loved ones is a change, though usually

filled with sadness but it can also be a time filled with gratitude and a host of memories (hopefully good ones). Some change is marking a rite of passage. Confirmation, Graduation, or a new job are examples. These can be exciting or scary. Can I get through this? What is expected of me now, that I have accomplished this goal? New expectations and goals replace the accomplishments made and goals achieved.

Change and facing it involves an act of faith. In Hebrews 11 Paul talks about faith. He gives a list of examples of faithful people. One such example is Abraham in Hebrews 11:8(ESV)

"By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to a place that he was to receive as an inheritance. And he went out, not knowing where he was going."

Abraham stepped out in faith to journey to an unknown place on a promise that God would reward him. Much of the change in life, takes a leap of faith. When you make plans, you have faith that

they will come together as you hoped. Sometimes things do not work out like we planned. You didn't get into the college you wanted, you change jobs unexpectedly, you lose a family member or friend. We face these changes with faith and knowing that God has something better planned than what we do. Change makes space for God to work new and exciting things in our lives and cause us to grow in our faith.

At the end of Hebrews 11 in verses 39-40 after his long list of examples Paul states:

39These were all commended for their faith, yet none of them received what had been promised, 40since God had planned something better for us so that only together with us would they be made perfect.”

As we go through the next couple months, some of us will experience many highs and lows. This is a part of change. There is excitement, fear, anticipation, dread, joy, and in it all; remembrance of the journey thus

far before moving on to the next stage. Take time to savor the journey. Do not rush through this time given to you. We learn from our experiences, but if you rush through; you might miss a special moment. Love and care for one another as you travel through the varying stages of life. The ups and downs of change flavor the experiences that we have in this life. They provide a color, a backdrop for which our life is viewed in retrospect. I would like to close with a poem that Corrie ten Boom would often share. Upon finishing the poem, ask yourself; when you reach the end of life's journey, what will the tapestry of your life look like? Will you embrace the beauty that comes from the polar opposites of darkness and light, sadness and happiness, etc. If we have too much of one, how can we come to appreciate the gift that it is? If we have faith in the Master Weaver, the final canvas of life can be a great masterpiece beyond what we could have imagined.

To all who love and support First United Methodist Church of Emmetsburg:

This year, we all learned that we can't do faith alone. When some of our elderly found themselves housebound in the face of the COVID-19 pandemic, they felt lost and isolated. Their faith was tested in the form of isolation. Some found a new way to worship through our online ministry. They were able to feel connected to their church family at Emmetsburg First United Methodist and were able to continue growing deeper in their relationship with God through our faith community.

Leading others to the Lord is the core of our mission at First UMC. As the pandemic unfolded, leading to skyrocketing rates of isolation, we knew we were called to step in to offer hope and comfort. That's why we launched new ministries to address the ongoing issues created by social isolation, which has reached out to many people. Not only do we have the online ministry, which reaches numerous people through Facebook, Zoom, and YouTube; but Pastor Hojin held outdoor services in driveways around town. This allowed those who could not come to an indoor service, to be able to attend worship in a safe environment. Another way we reach out to our shut-ins is by delivering the bulletin to them each week.

At the beginning of the pandemic, we created an Outreach Response Team, that helps deliver groceries to those unable to leave their homes during the pandemic. This resource has been accessed periodically throughout the pandemic. We were also able to offer this resource to a newer family in the community. By

doing so we were able to assist an overwhelmed mom and to bring the love of Christ to her whole family.

During the holidays seasons of Advent and Lent; we have created ways to worship from afar. Advent kits with activities were made, for each family to follow each week. We had families in our congregation record each week's activity from home. People were able to see one another online and our church family stayed connected. Pastor Hojin gathered together, through separate recordings, a group of our congregation to sing in a virtual choir. What beautiful music was made on Christmas Eve! More recently during Lent, we invited people to write a devotion for the Lent Season. The devotions were then put together in book that was distributed to all who wanted one. Many in our church, but also several who are not in from our church received these books. These devotions have been posted daily (on weekdays) on our Facebook page. Pastor invited people once again in the congregation to come together and record. This time they read the Gospels during Lent. These readings have been posted every day on our Facebook page. People are encouraged to share all of these posts; so that God's message can reach even more people all over the world!

Through all of this our youth ministry has endured. Teachers spent time putting together online classes and sending activity bags to the homes of our students. For summer VBS, we sent VBS to the homes of the kids who attended VBS in the past and offered (the at home VBS) online to those who wanted one. In the Fall, Sunday School started again in person, but was

moved back to online format in November. When COVID numbers started to drop, we were able to open once again on February 14th! We only have a few kids back so far, but we are hopeful more will return as we continue to reach out into the community. Youth groups met in the fall until November and began meeting again at the beginning of February. We are excited to see the numbers have not dropped. The kids were ready to be back!

These exciting new ministries and the creatively revised ministries are costly (in terms of time and money), especially at a time when church giving is low. 

It's been a combination of the kids attending the finals of wrestling and basketball, and a few of the girls were gone a couple of weeks going through CAN training. We are so pleased to see they were just as excited about getting back as we were. Thank you, Jesus.

In the past weeks we have been together, our scripture focus has been on love, kindness, giving of ourselves as Jesus would want us to do. The kids have done two acts of kindness; one week the made homemade cards and baked cookies for a member who has been ill, and one week made cards and put together a get-well basket for a member who had been through surgery.
