

As I shared above, all people are created in God's image. However, I also see pain and brokenness in every person. As I listened to Jaime* I heard the pain of drug addiction and how it cost him his family and his freedom. I also hear the stories of pain and brokenness in disease, death,

poverty, addiction, division, and a million other ways every day. This is the reality of sin in our world. Creation was good, but the fall separated us from God and one another. Sin dominates this world, and I see that reality in every aspect of ministry. My heart breaks for the hurt and brokenness I and others feel, but I don't stop there because I know redemption is found in Jesus Christ. I know this because I've known the pain of running from God, and I've felt and known God's unconditional, unending divine grace in my own life. The Good News for all people is Jesus' life, death, and resurrection. Through Jesus, all who call upon the name of Jesus are given amazing grace. The gift of grace is God's ongoing redemption of humanity. I saw this when Jaime* called to say

God is working through the staff at the shelter. I have seen this in a mother, who's attending Wednesday worship with her kids and is seeking a new life for her family. I see this sitting next to and holding the hand of people who are in hospice, nearing the end of their life. I see it in the laity's excitement to get involved in ministry because they are seeing and feeling God's new creation at work. in their midst. I've seen God's divine grace in a man who said he didn't believe in God. As we talked, he revealed church hurt, his issues with the church, and his pain with God. This man has begun attending church as God is working in and through him. Brokenness, pain, and sin are ever present but God's love is greater.

Sunday Worship Schedule


Lent Series - Follow Me: Returning to the Straight and Narrow

April 2 - Palm Sunday - Follow Me: Returning to the Straight & Narrow - Suffering Precedes Glory


April 9 - Easter - Sunrise Service & 10 am

The Endowment Task Force will meet and determine the distributions for requests early in April. Deadline for requests for non-budget projects is the end of March.

"How do you eat a whale?"

Dear First UMC Family -

5 years ago our church embarked on a significant growth project with the construction of the Family Life Center. Call it a leap of faith or prayerful long-range foresight in our future, we went forward with the help of God, the commitment of our membership's pledges, and the liquidation of our Endowment Fund. Through faithful fulfillment of pledges and continued dedication in support of the project, we have chipped away and are reaching a point where the building loan balance end is in sight, and we can see the light at the end of the tun-



nel. We have paid down a significant portion of the sizable construction loan, and have less than \$40,000 remaining, all while maintaining the daily operating needs of the church. While that is still a considerable amount, it's significantly less than we borrowed, and we have reached this level much sooner than the building committee anticipated. When we started this daunting project, the question towards financing to be asked was "How do you eat a whale?" Now we can answer "by taking one bite at a time."

No one can argue that building the FLC was not needed, and the new programs and ministries resulting have been an immeasurable benefit to our church and community. Therefore, we would ask that each member of our church consider making a new commitment, payment, or pledge toward the goal of having the loan paid off by the end of this year. With this financial obligation behind us, the Trustees will be able to concentrate on the next major concern of updating or replacing the heating system in the church, for which another loan may be required. Please give these needs your prayerful consideration and do your part to continue the support, growth, and service of our First UMC.

I would like to say thank you to everyone for your contributions and dedication to the church. We see doing an amazing job of paying off the new Family Life Center and should all be very proud of the progress that is being made. We started at a total cost of \$821,304 with a bank loan at \$311,487, and have paid it down to \$36,835. A special thank you to the many people who have stepped forward and made extra contributions for this purpose, it is greatly appreciated. With the help of your contributions, we were able to get ahead with our payments and should be able to finish this project in the next year if this rate is maintained. Once the Family Life Center is paid off, it will free up resources for other services that are much needed around the church
