Recently my daily devotions and scripture verses seem to highlight God as our shepherd. Many of these verses are familiar and comfortable to us, and one that stuck out recently is:


"I am the good shepherd; I know my sheep and my sheep know me - just as the Father knows me and I know the Father - and I lay down my life for the sheep." John 10:14-15

As I reread these words I remembered visiting my mother in the spring. She has a flock of sheep, and it was chore time. My mom, the grandkids, and I headed into the fence. Of course, this spooked the sheep, and they went to the top of the hill (away from us). They made quite a raucous and would not leave the safety of the hill, even though they were hungry. After the kids left the fence, my mom and I did the feeding chores, but they still wouldn't come. They know my mom; she feeds them daily, and they normally come running when they see her. I was not familiar and still within the fence, so they wouldn't come. They stood on

the hill watching and hungry but unwilling to move. My mom called for them and still no movement. I decided I'd step outside the fence thinking they'd be comfortable and come to eat if I were out. Still nothing. They heard their shepherd's voice; they

knew it was dinner time, but nobody would be the first. Finally, my mom started to walk up the hill to them. One ewe got brave enough to meet her shepherd and the rest followed. Even in their fear and confusion, they trusted the voice and presence of their shepherd.

We are also called to trust the voice of our Good Shepherd...God! When we spend our lives following God, we will recognize God's voice calling out to us in our fear and confusion. Isn't that a beautiful promise for those of us who know Jesus? If you don't know Jesus and you are standing on the top of the hill or in a deep valley hoping to see or hear the Shepherd, rest assured Jesus is calling you. The verse continues: "I have other sheep



that are not of this sheep pen. I must bring them also. They too will listen to my voice, and there shall be one flock and one shepherd." John 10:16. Whether you have heard or are searching for the Good Shepherd know that he is calling you by name! The Good Shepherd knows and loves you!

Confirmed in the faith

Confirmation, a rite many churches celebrate each spring, has biblical roots. In Acts 8, Peter and John are sent to lay their hands on new believers and pray for them to receive the Holy Spirit. In the early church, new Christians — usually adult converts — received baptism and confirmation as one ceremony. As more children were brought for baptism, pastors and priests would baptize, but only bishops would "confirm" a baptism, or make it official. Thus, the baptized were granted full membership in the church through confirmation.



Now confirmation allows young people, often after intensive Christian education, to profess for themselves the faith into which they were baptized. Confirmation serves as an important faith milestone, as young adults purposefully embrace a life of discipleship.

Lana's Ordination Paperwork:


Theology - Give examples of how the practice of ministry has affected your experience and understanding of the Lordship of Jesus Christ.

The practice of ministry has reiterated to me that belief and practice don't always go hand and hand. So often myself and others claim Jesus is the Lord of our life. We believe Jesus is the second person of the Trinity. We believe in the hypostatic union. We believe Jesus' life, death, and resurrection changed the world. So often we believe all of this but don't live it. Because we live in the here and now; we all too easily focus on things in this world rather than putting Jesus first.

One way I've seen this in ministry is church attendance. Sunday used to be a day to go to church. Many youth are tied up with traveling sports teams on Sundays. Families and adults are busy so they either plan activities, cleaning, or rest for Sunday mornings. Last year we started Wednesday worship with small groups, dinner, and a simple worship service. We have had a great response as it fits into people's schedules more easily. I often see a desire within those participating in ministry for their faith to fit into their schedule. Outside the church, I see and hear many reasons for not participating. I don't judge this as right or wrong, it simply is the reality that many American Christians believe and claim Jesus is Lord but practice doesn't always line up.

Jesus is Lord should take priority. This claim is a radically transformative belief in our lives, or it should be. Jesus is Lord of my life means Jesus should come first. We should live as Jesus calls us to live. We should be growing and becoming more like Jesus. But many in the church, on the fringes of the church, and outside the church don't understand the concept of Jesus as Lord of my life. As I continue in ministry I try to lead by example, but I am far from perfect. My preaching often speaks to this very need as I talk about a relationship with God. I believe in ministry and in my personal life I've come to the same conclusion: we cannot and do not live as Jesus is Lord of our life on our own. Jesus knew that so he sent us the Holy Spirit.

In this series, we'll see what the Bible and Dr. Seuss have to say about how we encounter and engage our differences.






